- The Building Young Men Mentoring Program was started in 1992 to support young men in the transition to successful manhood. The program involves a structured curriculum that offers a long-term group mentoring program. The objectives for the student participants are:
 - (1) Improve self-esteem;
 - (2) improve academic performance;
 - (3) encourage students to complete high school and pursue education beyond the high school level; and
 - (4) increase their social awareness and problem solving skills in order to enable them to make more responsible decisions.
- The program is open to young males ages 7 to 18. The program meets every 2nd and 4th Saturday, 11:00 a.m. at the Jubilee Center. **Transportation is provided.** Special activities will also be scheduled- amusement parks, college tours funded by Genworth and Wells Fargo Foundation.
